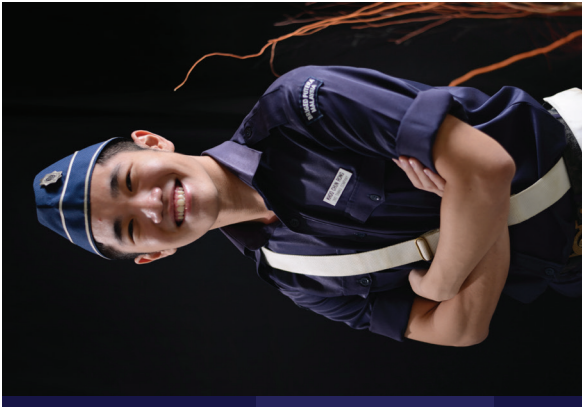

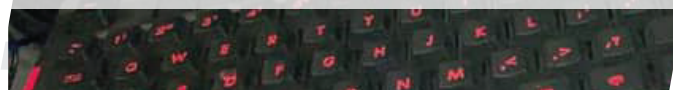
VIRTUAL CLASSROOM

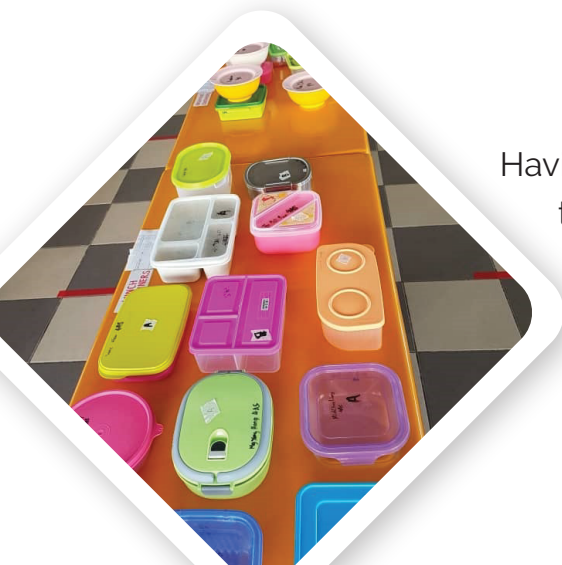


NEW NORM IN School

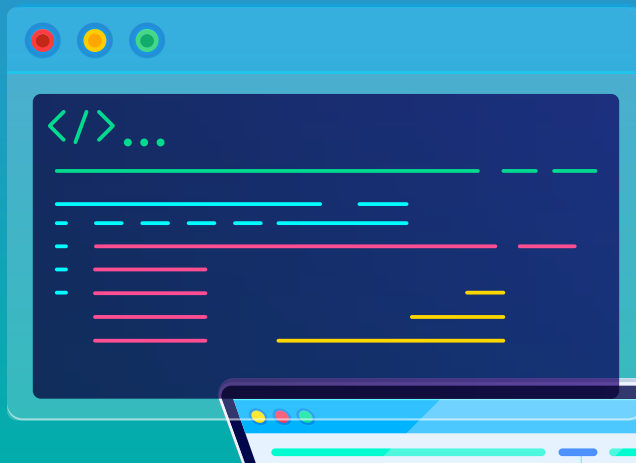

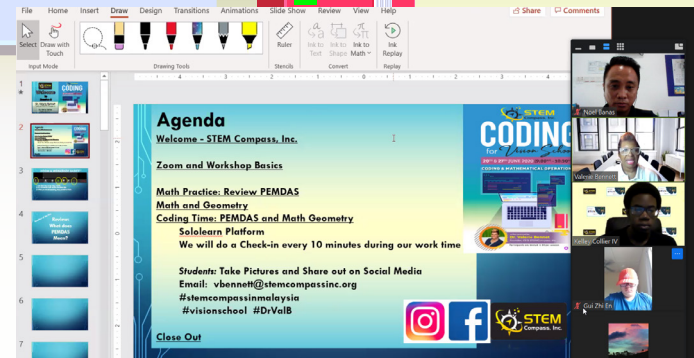
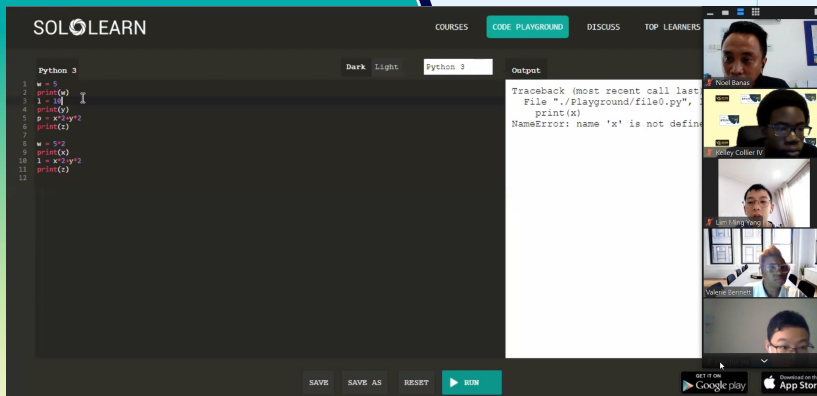
20TH & 27TH JUNE 2020
